Open Call for Papers

Special Issue on “Immigration in OECD Countries”

Paper Submission Deadline: March 1st, 2019

The Canadian Journal of Economics/Revue Canadienne d'Économie is having an open call for papers for a special issue that will address economic questions related to immigration in OECD countries. Submitted papers are expected to make a significant contribution to understanding the determinants and consequences of immigration for receiving economies.

While new submissions are most welcome, this call follows from the 8th annual OECD-CEPII Conference “Immigration in OECD Countries” which took place at the OECD in Paris on 10-11 December 2018. The usual *CJE* fees will be waived for papers presented at that conference.

All submissions will go through the *CJE*'s regular peer review process. Hillel Rapoport (Paris School of Economics and CEPII; hillel.rapoport@psemail.eu) and Arthur Sweetman (McMaster University; arthur.sweetman@mcmaster.ca) will co-edit the special issue, which is expected to be published in 2020.

Submission Guidelines:

Submitted papers must describe original research which is not published nor currently under review elsewhere.
